Why learn to touch type?

More and more of our children's work and prep is now completed on a computer, using a keyboard. Learning to touch-type means children can work faster, potentially at double the speed, and it also allows them to focus on content

instead of the keyboard – meaning they're likely to produce higher quality work.

Touch-typing improves accuracy and has been found to help children improve reading, writing and spellings. It can be of particular benefit for children with dyslexia who find typing easier than handwriting. Best of all, it's a skill for life that's quick to learn and isn't complicated!
